### **FROM THE PASTOR**

Grace is truly an amazing place (and no, don't start humming "Amazing Grace" – that's NOT what I meant!).

But think about it. In the space of ten days between May 31 and June 9 Grace members: combined to bring off a highly successful Synod Assembly at the lowest cost EVER to the West Virginia-Western Maryland Synod, grossed over \$4,000 for charity, presented the Bishop and the Synod with a virge, a gift that is probably unique in the entire ELCA, led worship for nearly 170 people with a combined choir of members from about seven congregations, introduced a new hymn to the church, provided meals for a total of about 400 people, coordinated three refreshment breaks for about the same number of people, modeled a new way for the church to raise money to support special ministries by feeding people ice cream and listening to Irish music, cut and served thousands of strawberries along with hundreds of pieces of cake and dozens of hot dogs and cans of pop, burned the mortgage for \$300,000 in building renovations (paid off in three years), and did all this while fixing two broken air conditioners while the Bishop was riding around our parking lot in a motorcycle sidecar.

I defy you to find any other congregation that can make a claim to that kind of activity in the space of less than two weeks. And even if they could match all the other stuff, where else is the bishop riding around in a motorcycle sidecar in a cope, miter, and sunglasses with his crozier blessing the congregation?

I like to think that 10-day period kind of sums up Grace: Liturgical, cost effective, service oriented, creative, and a little bit "out there". If you look at our mission statement, the only thing missing is the discipleship piece.

That brief period dealt with stewardship, worship, mission, fellowship, property, and connections to the larger Synod and church. And because the design of the Friday Assembly schedule and the inclusion of worships in the agenda was largely the brainchild of your pastor and Council vice-president, you could even argue that education was included.

Grace has nine standing committees: Worship and Music, Learning and Christian Education, Communications, Stewardship, Finance, Outreach and Evangelism, Missions, Fellowship, and Property. In that short period, everyone of them was active.

*Worship and Music* organized and led the worship services with our own staff organizing special music and the combined choir. Yours truly wrote the text for the new hymn that was sung at the Friday night liturgy.

*Fellowship* organized the dinner after church on Sunday before we burned the mortgage.

*Learning and Christian Education* pushed ahead with the information that explained our connections to the larger church and led to the invitation to host the Synod Assembly.

*Communications* publicized all the events and, along with *Outreach and Evangelism*, supported the worship on “Branding and Marketing the Church”.

*Stewardship* and *Finance* worked over the past four years to bring us to the point where our debt on the renovations and organ installation was paid off.

*Missions* coordinated and ran the Strawberry Festival, which was a LOT more work than this simple sentence says.

*Property* looked to the repairs and our staff and volunteers made sure everything was where it was when it needed to be.

Grace is not a huge congregation. Granted it is bigger than most, but certainly not as large as some.

What happened here over ten days belies our size and indicates what a truly amazing place Grace is.

So, take a breather, Grace: you’ve earned it!

But don’t rest too long. There is work to do for the kingdom, and Vacation Bible School is coming up, the Food Pantry distribution will be happening, folks are invited in for Game Day, and we’re here every Sunday to praise the amazing God who empowers us and gives us that amazing grace that keeps us going and calls us into discipleship and mission. (Okay – NOW you can start humming!)

## **Church Word of the Month**

Like every organization or profession, the church has words and language that are unique to its conversations and practices. In order to help folks navigate this sometimes-confusing vocabulary, this month we begin a new feature in the *Vine* called, “Church Word of the Month”. Each month we will feature a different word or term and define it along with some background.

Since the summer issue of the *Vine* is a “twofer” (combined July and August), we will start the series this month with two words.

NAVE (rhymes with save) – The nave is the part of a church building where the congregation gathers for worship. It comes from Latin (a LOT of church words come from Latin and Greek) and is related to the same root from which we get the word navy. Supposedly the word came about from people looking up to the roof of the church building. In order to build large vaulted structures without extra internal support early church builders turned to ship builders. The ceiling of the church often looked like the inside of a boat that had been turned upside down because, well, frankly that’s what the folks who built it knew how to build. The image of the ship has also been used as a symbol of the church, and you will sometimes see the church represented on paraments and in stained glass as a ship.

NARTHEX (NAR'-thecks) – the narthex is the part of the building where the congregation gathers before and after worship. It is kind of the entry, or vestibule, into the building. In Grace, the narthex is actually the Gathering Room. The word is related to the Greek word for funnel, which makes sense when you think that people are funneled through the wider narthex to the narrow opening of the entry door to go into the nave.

## **Appliance Upgrade**

After nearly 40 years the refrigerator and freezer in the kitchen are in need of replacement! The refrigerator is rusting out on the bottom and the freezer has been having trouble for some time. There was some concern that it would not make it through to the Strawberry Festival, but prayers, daily checks, and the threat of an exorcism kept it going!

Carney and Sloan offered us a deal on a commercial grade “scratch and dent” double door, stainless steel refrigerator and a companion freezer for \$4,588.00. The larger refrigerator will help us with those times like the Strawberry Festival, Salad Luncheon, Thanksgiving Dinner, and Pancake Supper when a larger volume of space is needed, while the freezer will be essentially the same size as the current one. Stainless Steel will make it easier to clean and reduce the chances of rust. The price includes delivery and set up and hauling away the old appliances.

Thrivent has provided \$3,000.00, and the remainder of the Salad Luncheon money (after paying for the new fence around the play area) will be applied to the purchase, along with two designated gifts. This leaves an outstanding balance on the purchase of \$30.00. The new refrigerator and freezer will be delivered in time for the Fourth of July.

We are grateful to everyone who is contributing to this effort to sustain and upgrade our ministry resources. If you would like to donate the balance of \$30.00 to finish paying for these replacements, please speak to Pastor.

## **Riesbeck Gift Cards Available**

Thrivent is making a \$3,000.00 donation to the purchase of a new refrigerator and freezer. The money comes from the proceeds from the sale of Riesbeck Gift Cards.

Thrivent buys the cards at a discounted rate and resells them at face value. Thrivent then keeps the difference to use for special projects around the church (like a new fridge!) and in the community. You can help with this effort by purchasing gift cards from Tami Tysk or Judith Myers.

You spend the same amount you would anyway and pay for the face value of the card, and the church picks up the difference. So everybody wins!

## **Change**

Jack Schneider has been moved to a rehab center near Columbus and will be moving again shortly to a more permanent rehab center to continue his recovery from multiple surgeries. As soon as an address is available for the long-term rehab center it will be published in the bulletin. Meanwhile, continue to keep Jack in your prayers.

## **Cushions or Chairs?**

When Grace formed the idea was to replace many of the pews with pew chairs to provide flexible seating. Because of a delay in delivery the number of chairs was reduced so that we could occupy the building more quickly and some of the pews were put back in place.

While getting ready for the funeral last week I noticed no fewer than nine cushions on the pews. We always move these for weddings, funerals, and other special services. While they are no doubt needed by some people, they also send a message when you are not here. Like Sheldon on the *Big Bang Theory*, the message is “That’s my spot. Don’t sit in my spot.” Not very welcoming!

But the fact that nine people are using them says that about 15% of our Sunday morning regulars want cushioning.

So, let's have a discussion. Would you like to see Grace add more cushioned chairs with arms to help push up when you stand? Or would you like to have the pews cushioned? Or should we just keep going with various sizes and shapes and colors of cushions scattered around the room?

## **Vacation Bible School**

The 2019 Hilltop Community Vacation Bible School will be held from Sunday, July 21 to Thursday, July 25. Sessions begin at 6:15 PM and end at 8:00 PM. Once again, Grace will host the program, which is a joint effort of Our Lady of Peace, Bethlehem Presbyterian, and Grace Churches. Classes are offered for children who are at least 3 years old through those who have completed grade 6.

The theme this year is a trip around the world with "The Incredible Race". The children move to a different continent each night to explore a different culture and climate and see how sin separate us from God and one another, and how God's love for the human race crosses all boundaries and nations. A special feature of this year's program is a new science section.

We have enough teachers for this year, but aides are still needed, especially for the pre-school classes. If you can help one or more nights, please speak to Evelyn Birch or Pastor.

Also, six people are needed each night for the opening and closing skits. If you have always wanted to present your Lucille Ball, Reese Witherspoon, Cary Grant, or Adam Sandler imitation, please speak to Pastor.

Juice boxes are needed for snacks. Each of the three churches is being asked to provide 70 juice boxes. If you can donate one or more packs, please leave them at the Welcome Desk. (DO NOT leave them at the Food Pantry table – extra leftover boxes will be donated to our Food Pantry at the end of the week).

Paper towel tubes (NOT toilet paper) and used men's ties (with no soup stains) are needed for craft projects. Please put your donations in the box under the Memorial Desk.

## **Safety First**

As part of our on-going process to make our building safer and more secure, we are addressing various children's issues. It has been pointed out that the back door by the nursery is a vulnerable spot for a non-custodial parent or other person to do a "snatch-and-grab" with a child in the nursery. As a result, we have taken to locking that door whenever children are present in that room.

However, the other part of the problem is that it is also a door that children can "escape" through if they are not being closely supervised OR if they get away. And if you haven't noticed, little kids can move pretty darn fast! To reduce the chances of a child getting out of the building unnoticed, an escapement alarm has been added to that door. The alarm will sound if anyone goes out the door without permission. It is placed high on the door so that children cannot reach it. Whenever children are in the nursery the alarm will be turned on. If you use that door, check with Pastor and he will show you how to turn the alarm off.

We appreciate the concern for our children's safety and ask for your patience while we continue to work out the "bugs" of new systems and protocols to keep our children safe.
